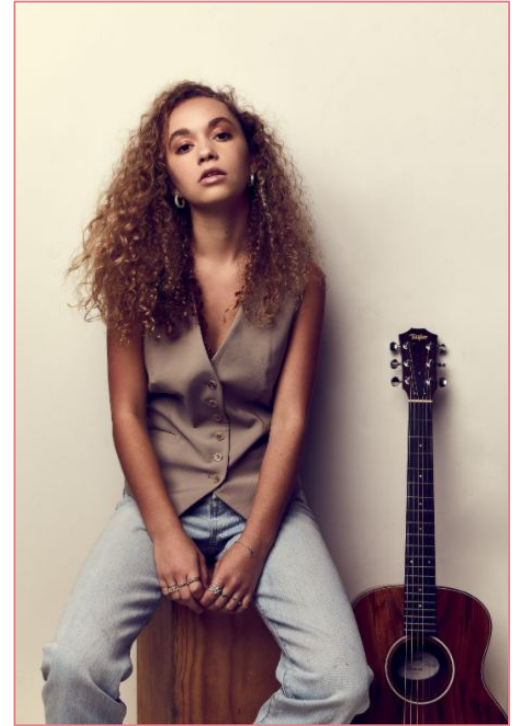

**JILLIAN SHEA SPAEDER**



Jillian Shea Spaeder is an actress and singer-songwriter. The young starlet can currently be seen playing a lead role alongside Jillian Bell and Isla Fisher in the newly released Disney+ original film [“Godmothered”](#). She has two singles included within the film’s soundtrack: [“Rise Up \(Joy to the World\)”](#) and [“Hero”](#). Jillian is best known for her series regular role as ‘Bailey’ on the Disney XD series “Walk the Prank”. Jillian also recently appeared as a guest star on Netflix’s “No Good Nick” (with Sean Astin and Melissa Joan Hart), on Disney Channel’s “Just Roll with It,” and in a supporting role in the film “To the Beat!: Back 2 School.”

In addition to her acting career, the 18-year old is also a talented singer-songwriter. Jillian got her start singing and playing the piano when she was five years old, discovered her love of guitar/ukulele at 12, and is currently writing and recording her original music. Her first two singles, [“Story”](#) (July 2018) and [“Barely Changed”](#) (Jan 2019) were produced by music director and producer Mike Avenaim and mastered at Capitol Records. Jillian then released [“Talk Too Loud”](#) (June 2019) and [“Something Better”](#) (Sept 2019) while working with acclaimed producer Mikal Blue (*Colbie Caillat, Jason Mraz, Five for Fighting, One Republic*). Tapping into her film expertise, **Jillian co-wrote, directed, and produced her music video for “Something Better”** (Sept 2019). Following this record, Jillian released [“Runaway”](#) (Nov 2019) which she co-composed as the theme song for the Brat TV show *Crazy Fast*. She has since written and released several songs in the past few months, including [“3:43 am”](#) (produced by Blue), [“i don’t know,”](#) (produced by Bill Spaeder) and [“Worth My Time”](#) (produced by Avenaim). Jillian has several more songs in the works for release in the next few months and continues to write when she is not in the recording booth.

As a Philadelphia-area native who primarily resides in Los Angeles, Jillian started her acting career with several roles in regional musical theater. It was a trip to Hollywood that changed Jillian’s life through a chance encounter with her manager, who encouraged her to consider moving to California to enter the film and television industry. In her first three months in Hollywood, she appeared in the digital DreamWorksTV series “OMG!,” had a guest starring role on Nickelodeon’s “Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn,” and booked a series regular role on Disney XD’s “Walk the Prank.” This year and beyond, Jillian’s career will continue to blossom with her leading role in the Disney+ film “Godmothered” and with more original music on the way.

Aside from music and acting, Jillian enjoys being able to utilize her voice for change in the world. She has dedicated her time to both the **National Multiple Sclerosis Society** a cause she became active in after her Aunt received an MS diagnosis, and **Children International** through which her family sponsors kids in need. She also actively uses her platform to promote Equality and Inclusivity.

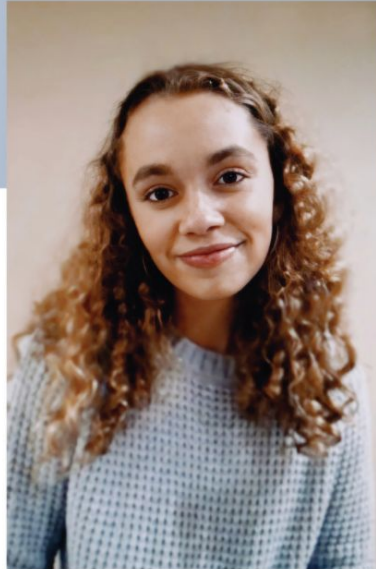
#### WHERE DID YOUR PASSION FOR THE PERFECT CREATIVE TALENTS BEGIN?

Jillian: "I grew up in a musical family. As a child, I was always putting on shows in the basement, where I was not only the talent, but the ticket taker, caller, and emcee! My parents have a band, and when I was also rehearsing, I started going up to sing a few songs. I was also interested in acting, so I took classes and had private coaching, and I was in some regional theatre shows before coming out to California."

#### TELL US ABOUT YOUR DISNEY JOURNEY HOW DID YOU START, WHAT DID YOU LEARN, AND HOW YOU GOT TO WHERE YOU ARE TODAY?

J: "I met my manager at a performing arts competition in Hollywood the summer I was 11. She signed me and encouraged me to come out there for pilot season the following February. My mom and I went out for nine weeks, and at the very end I auditioned for the role of Bailey on Disney XD's *Walk the Prank* – and booked the role! I ran for three seasons, so I learned so much about life on set, both in front of and behind the camera. Just before I auditioned for *Godmothered*, I did a guest star spot on Disney Channel's *Just Roll With It*, which is produced by the same producers. So it was fun to see a lot of the same people who worked on our show. Then came my role on *Godmothered*, so my journey with the Disney family continues!"

#### WHAT HAS BEEN YOUR FAVORITE THING ABOUT WORKING BEHIND THE SCENES SO FAR? DO YOU ENJOY DIRECTING AND



#### PRODUCE MORE THAN ACTING AND SINGING, OR THE OTHER WAY AROUND?

J: "I've never had to do just one job behind the camera, so I really enjoy the creativity of producing and the challenge of directing for the same project. It will be interesting the first time I have to do just one or the other! I feel equally passionate about performing the different roles on both sides of the camera, and I'm fortunate that I get the opportunities to do them all."

#### HOW HAVE YOU SEEN YOUR VOTERS COME TOGETHER AFTER RELEASING YOUR SHORT FILM "IT COUNTS"?

J: "It's inspiring how young people are getting so invested in voting and using their voices for good. Their enthusiasm was evident all over social media."

#### WHAT TYPE OF MUSIC INSPIRES YOU THE MOST? R&B, POP, ETC.?

J: "I am most inspired when I listen to alternative music or singer-songwriters."

#### DO YOU HAVE ANY HIDDEN TALENTS?

J: "I can crack about ten markers together and balance the tower of them in my palm for a long time!"

#### TELL US ABOUT "GODMOTHERED" IN WHICH YOU'RE BOTH SINGING AND ACTING CAN YOU GIVE US A LITTLE SNIPPET OF WHAT WE'RE LOOKING FORWARD TO?

J: "My character Jane sings and plays guitar, but she has a bad case of stage fright. Eleanor, the young godmother-in-training who shows up to help Jane's mother find her happily ever after, tries to help Jane overcome her problem. We find out in the holiday concert scene at the end whether or not Jane is able to

do that."

#### WHAT'S UP WITH YOUR NEW SINGLE "A LITTLE CONVERSATION"? TELL US THE INSPIRATION BEHIND "A LITTLE CONVERSATION"

J: "I wrote 'A Little Conversation' with Sarah Thiele, a musician and songwriter who one of my producers, Mikal Blue, introduced me to at his studio. Sarah and I sat down at the piano, and she started playing a pretty chord progression. I came up with the first lyric, and the song just evolved from there. We loved how the raw acoustic sound of just piano and vocals matched the tone of the lyrics, so we decided to keep the production simple. Sarah also sings back-up vocals on the track. It will be released in January as part of my first album."

#### WE KNOW YOU'VE DEDICATED TIME TO BOTH NATIONAL MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS SOCIETY AND CHILDREN INTERNATIONAL. WHAT OTHER ORGANIZATIONS ARE YOU PASSIONATELY IN SUPPORT OF?

J: "My friend Lisa and I started an organization called 'Strawberry Social Club' during quarantine. At first it was an Instagram platform to host virtual parties weekly during isolation due to COVID-19, but over time we started focusing on how we could make a difference and spread awareness for important causes. We've created a line of merchandise where 100% of the proceeds go towards a listed charity or organization. We are passionate about using our platforms to help people in need!"

#### WHERE DO YOU SEE YOUR CAREER BLOSSOMING IN THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS?

J: "As an actor, I want to do more dramatic roles and make more movies. As a singer-songwriter, I hope to do some collaboration with other songwriters and maybe start publishing my songs."

# NEW MOVIE, MUSIC FOR JILLIAN SHEA SPAEDER

The Philly-born performer also works for change in the world

**P**hilly-born actress and singer/songwriter Jillian Shea Spader, best known for her series regular role on Disney XD's "Walk the Prank," can currently be seen as a lead in the Disney+ original film, "Godmothered." She appears alongside Jillian Bell and Isla Fisher. Spader also sings two songs in the movie and has new original music coming out in the new year.

Spader also recently appeared as a guest star on Netflix's "No Good Nick" (with Sean Astin and Melissa Joan Hart), on Disney Channel's "Just Roll with It," and in a supporting role in the film "To the Beat: Back 2 School." In addition to her acting career, the 18-year-old is also a talented singer-songwriter. She got her start singing and playing the piano when she was 5 years old, discovered her love of guitar/ukulele at 12, and is currently writing and recording her own original music. She has several more songs in the works for release in the next few months and continues to write when she is not in the recording booth.

Aside from music and acting, Spader enjoys being able to utilize her voice for change in the world. She has dedicated her time to both the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and Children International, through which her family sponsors kids in need. She also actively uses her platform to promote equality and inclusivity.

PW recently caught up with Spader to talk about her career and what's ahead.

**Let's go back to the beginning. When did you become interested in acting and music? Who were some of your earliest influences?**

Growing up in a musical family, I've always been drawn to performing. My parents say I had really good pitch at a young age and started singing as soon as I could talk! Besides shows in my basement for family and friends, I did some elementary school and local musical theatre class shows, which really gave me the acting bug. I got private coaching and eventually booked roles in several local equity theatre productions before heading out to Los Angeles to audition for TV and film roles.

My earliest influences are probably The Beatles and Queen. My parents have a band that plays everything from the '60s through now, so I've been exposed to many different genres of music. When I was around 9, I started doing some guest appearances at their gigs singing songs from artists like Alicia Keys and Adele. A few years later, I started playing guitar and writing my own music. Now my influences are singer-songwriters like Ed Sheeran, Shawn Mendes and Julia Michaels.

**After appearances in a number of television series, you landed a leading role in "Godmothered." Why were you drawn to this film? What were some of the highlights of the production process?**

"Playing Jane in "Godmothered" was really a dream role for me. Acting in a Disney holiday movie was already a big draw, but the character also sings and plays guitar. Being able to do three things I love in one project was an incredible opportunity, so I'll always be thankful to the director, producers and casting directors for choosing me to tell Jane's story.

One of the first things I got to do when I arrived in Boston for filming was to record "Rise Up (Joy to the World)" and "Hem" in the studio, so that was a highlight. Then, performing "Rise Up" with a choir behind me and a huge audience in front of me for the big concert scene was surreal. One of the funniest memories on set involved a "newer" actor. We filmed a few scenes with a little piglet named Yenny, who interrupted some of the takes with her squealing or untimely entrances into the scene! It was a challenge to get the scenes done, but we laughed a lot at her antics.

**You sing two songs in "Godmothered" and have new music dropping in 2021. Talk a little about your music career. Where do you find the inspiration for the songs you write?**

I started writing music a few years ago, and most of the time I find inspiration in the people or things happening around me. For example, I wrote my song "I don't know" while sitting in a parked car (that's the first line of the song) and my song "2021" as a response to our crazy year finally coming to an end. Other times, I just get ideas for melodies and certain lyrics pop into my head.

**You're originally from Philadelphia. What was it like growing up here? Were there any people or organizations here that helped launch your career?**

I grew up in Malvern, which is such a cool, small town and close enough for my family to jump on the train or drive into the city for a Phillies game, a show at Walnut Street Theatre, or lunch at Reading Terminal Market. Our house is near the borough, so I have always loved being able to walk with my friends to Wawa or Scoops 'N Smiles, my favorite ice cream place.

My career definitely started here, although I had no idea then that it would actually become my career! I first started taking musical theatre classes at the Music Training Center, which had a Malvern location at that time. I later took voice lessons at the Music Workshop in Berwyn, and was a theatre student at the New School at Media Theatre. But my first big "break" was when I was cast in an equity theatre production, "The Holiday Piano," at People's Light Theatre Company in Malvern. The only child in a cast of 12, I played "Pia" in their production of Cinderella, which ran for about three months. It was such a great experience, and I'll always feel like it was the one that started me on the professional part of my journey.

The following year, I portrayed Young Eponine in Media Theatre's production of "Les Misérables" during the holiday season. Just a few weeks later, I headed to Los Angeles for pilot season, and that's when I booked the series regular role on "Walk the Prank."

**How have the pandemic and all of the closures impacted your career? How have you spent any downtime?**

The entertainment industry was on hold for about six months because of the pandemic, so I spent a lot of that time working on music. I did some remote recording for a few songs I'd already been working on with my producers, and I also wrote a few new songs. One of those was "I don't know," which I wrote and recorded in two days. My dad and I produced it, a friend came over to safely help me record a music video, and we released both the song and video that same week.

**Before the past election, you were one of the creators behind "It Counts," a film that provided education for young voters. Why was it important to you to be involved in a project like this?**

I have been vocal about issues like equality the past few years. I turned 18 in September, so as a new voter I felt it was important to use my voice to help encourage others to make their voices heard – by voting. My friends and I made the short film to encourage teens to take an active role in determining the future of this country, if not in this election, then in future ones. The message is that every vote counts!

**In addition to your professional career, you find time to give back, and are active with the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and Children International. How did you get involved with these organizations?**

My aunt has MS, and my uncle started the MuckFest, a mud run to raise awareness and support people with MS, in our area many years ago. A lot of my family members and I do the run every year, and my aunt is always there waiting for her muddy hugs at the end! My family also sponsored three kids through Children International as we were growing up; the ages and genders of the kids matched those of my siblings and me. This organization helps children in impoverished communities the health care, education, and support they need to make a lasting change in their lives. I hope to do even more to help support the National MS Society and Children International in the future.

**In addition to your new music, what's ahead for you? Any new acting projects you can share?**

I have a few projects that might be coming up, but they are in the pre-production phase at this point. In the meantime, auditions are starting to come in again, so I hope to have more to report soon.

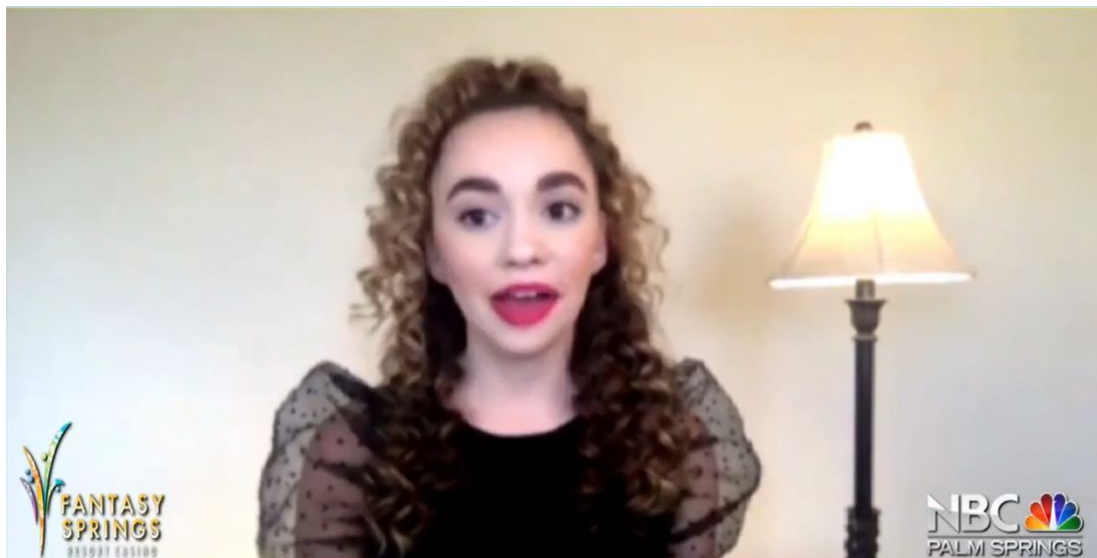

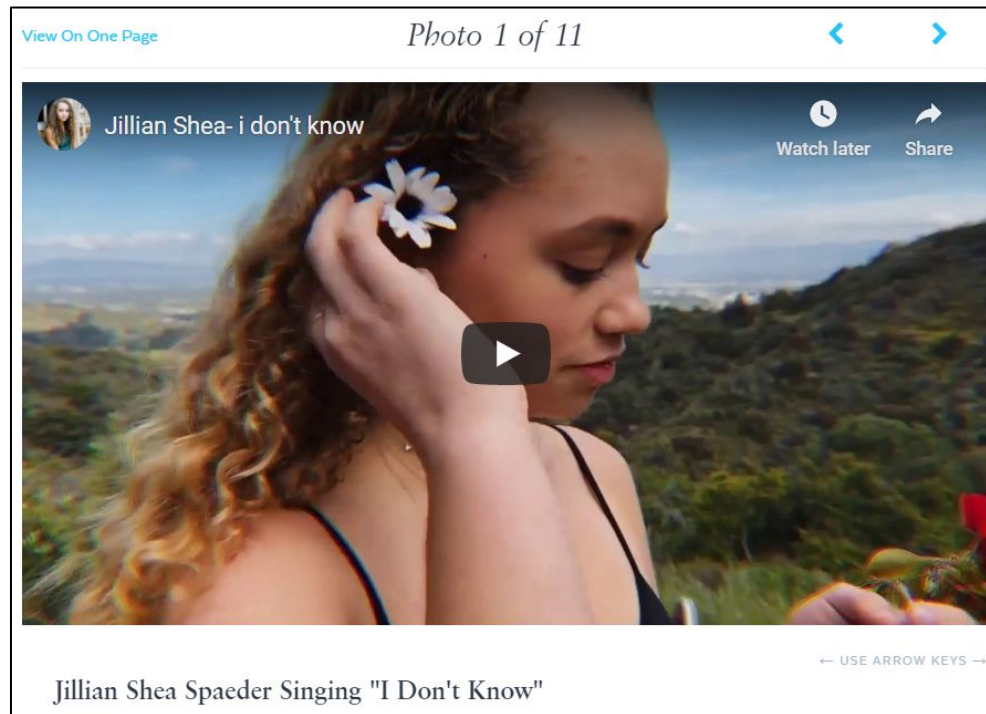

How does it feel to be a first-time voter? According to actor and singer **Jillian Shea Spaeder**, who just turned 18, it's pretty great.
